lg =large

We will also be passing a sheet at guild that we hope will help us decide how many cookbooks we should order. If you will give some thought as to how many you will be considering buying for Christmas, graduation, wedding, anniversary etc. gifts we would appreciate you telling us that number. We plan on keeping the price in the \$10 range. This will in no way obligate you to that number, but will hopefully keep our ordering in the proper perspective.

If you are not sending in your recipes by way of computer, please follow these additional guidelines.

**TYPE OR PRINT CLEARLY IN INK, not pencil, AND PLACE ONLY ONE
RECIPE
PER PAGE.**

List all ingredients in order of use in the ingredients list and directions.

Be sure to include container sizes, (see list for proper abbreviations).

Use names of ingredients in the directions, example write "Combine flour and sugar"

DO NOT write " combine first three ingredients"

Include temperatures, for cooking, chilling, baking and/or freezing times.

Include a recipe note as to why this recipe is special to you and your family, where it originated or any other reason why the recipe is noteworthy.

October Program

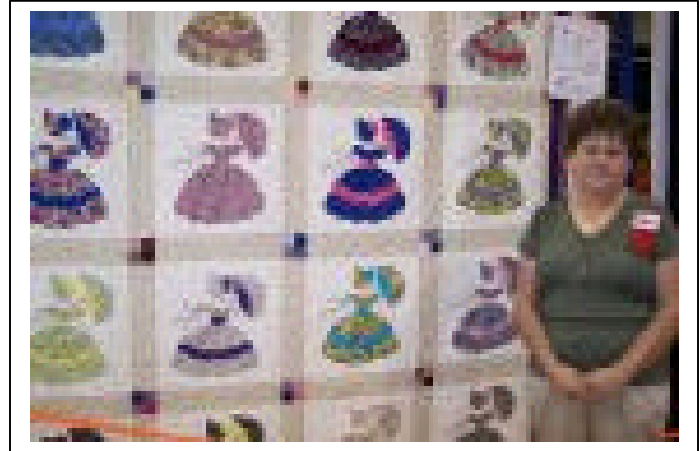
October 25
