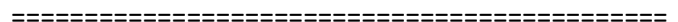

# PADUCAH

I have some space left so I'll tell you about my recent visit to the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, KY. We travel to Michigan every year or so to see family and friends. Paducah is almost on the way, so we sometimes stop there. This is a worthwhile stop, and I encourage you to go there anytime it is "almost on the way" in your travels. You can get there in a very long day (almost 600 miles), so it might be worth a special trip, perhaps with a group of compatible quilters.

Their permanent collection is wonderful, as you know, and the small "WOW" miniature collection is insane.

There are two traveling shows:

- 12<sup>th</sup> Quilt Japan, conducted by Japan Handicraft Instructors Association. will be up until August 9. It is a mixture of traditional and contemporary Japanese quilts. For traditional, think floral, incredible hand applique, rigid symmetry. The contemporary quilts used lots of lame, abstract forms, swirling shapes. Workmanship is flawless with lots and lots of handwork.
- Art Quilts of the Midwest will be shown until October 11. These are very personal quilts, some with social and political views, some simply reflections on the flora, fauna and landscapes of the Midwest. And some are purely design. There are even a few that I would not consider to be quilts at all. An interesting group of work.

Of the several fabric stores in Paducah, Hancock's of Paducah is the most famous, and no trip would be complete without a stop. In fact, it is the only quilt shop I have been to in Paducah (non-quilting husbands have their limits). It is a huge and impressive store—rows and rows of bolts; walls of notions and patterns, friendly clerks.
