Chris Morris called the meeting to order and introduced our speaker, Robin Williamson.

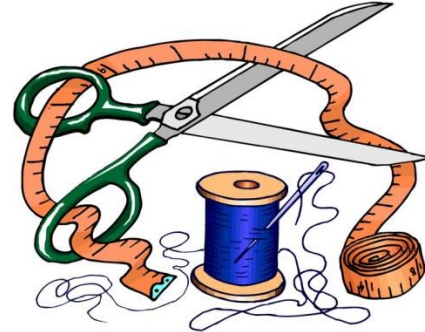
